CA SHALL Impartial View Of Japanese Problem Sought In Survey

Conducting a survey of the sentiment of the govnment officials and California congressmen towards the Japanese Ameri-can, Mrs. Ruth W. Kingman, executive secretary of the Pacific Coast Committee on American Princi-ples and Fair Play, seid that she is seeking an that she is seeking an impartial view of the Japanese picture in the United States, according to a recent article in the Pacific Citizen.

She described the committee, which includes many prominent California educators, as a fact-finding group interested in an objective approach to the Japanese problem.

"We are interested in presenting a fair picture of the problem to prevent prejudice being built up against Japanese which would prevent many from assuming their rightful position as American citizens when war conditions permit their raturn to their West Coast homes," stated Mrs. Kingman, as explained that this committee had never advocated the return of the Japanese to the Pacific the War De-Coast until partment had deemed such a move feasible.




